If so, state when the interruption took place and give particulars.

8. Were you ever told by any owner or tenant of the land crossed by the way, or by anyone in their employment, that the way was not public?

If so, state when and give particulars and dates.

9. Have you ever known any locked gates or other obstructions to the way?

If so, state when and give particulars

10. Have you ever seen notices such as "Private", "No Road", "No Thoroughfare" or "Trespassers will be Prosecuted" on or near the way?

If so, what did the notices say?

11. Are you a friend/acquaintance of the landowner and thus use the way with his/her implied consent?

12. Have you ever asked permission to use the way?

13. Please give any other information that you think is relevant.



GUIDANCE NOTE ON THE COMPLETION OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY
EVIDENCE FORMS

1. Forms may be photocopied as necessary.
2. As far as possible the witness should complete the form.
3. Each witness should complete a separate form.
4. A plan clearly showing the route of the claimed right of way must be attached to each form. Each witness must initial the plan at each end of the claimed route to confirm that this is the route that she/he has used.
5. The route of the claimed right of way should be described as accurately as possible, if possible giving details of such things as property boundaries, stiles, gates, bridges and stepping stones, etc.
6. The witnesses may be personally interviewed in connection with the information given in the form.
7. The details contained in the forms may be used as evidence in future proceedings and the witnesses should be prepared to support the information by giving verbal evidence, or by providing a statutory declaration at a later date, or other written confirmation of the details supplied, at any local public inquiry that may be held.
8. Witnesses should indicate whether they are prepared to give evidence either in a court or at a public inquiry. If a witness is unable/unwilling to give evidence in person, his/her statement will be taken into account, although the evidential value of a statement is considerably reduced if it cannot be subject to cross-examination.
9. If a witness would be unable to give evidence at an inquiry because of ill health, age, etc she/he should indicate this on the form.
10. The information given on this form may be copied to landowners or objectors and become available for public inspection.
